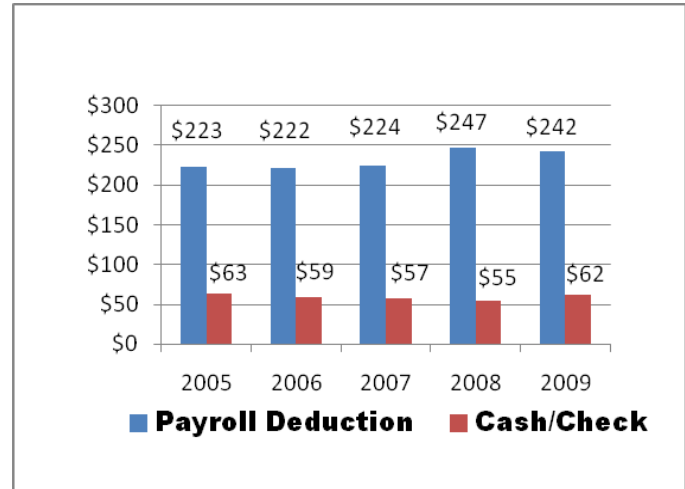
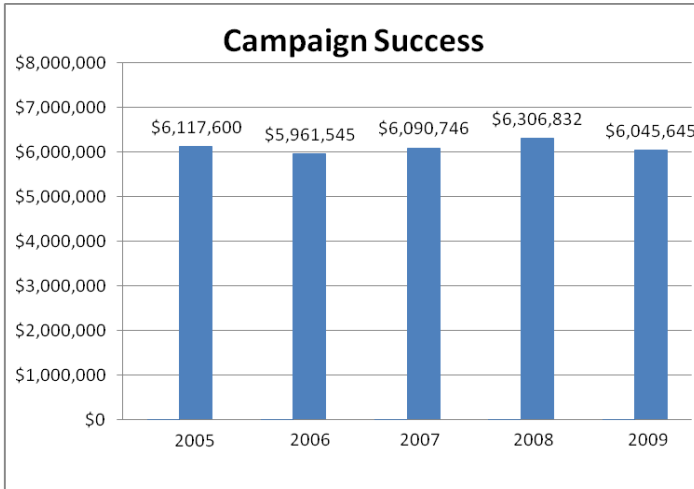




**Hawaii-Pacific Area

The Hawaii-Pacific Area Combined Federal Campaign is one of the nation's largest and most successful. Our campaign encompasses the State of Hawaii plus the Northern Mariana Islands, Guam, and American Samoa. during the 2009 campaign, over \$6 million was raised to support International, National and Local charitable organization. **YOU** made it happen!



The Federal employees within the Hawaii-Pacific Area Combined Federal Campaign have always been very supportive of the campaign. this outstanding achievement attests to the generosity and community spirit of our Federal military and civilian employees.

Using payroll deduction is one of the greatest advantages of giving through the CFC. Payroll deduction is often the easiest way to give. A donor is able to spread his or her gift over the entire year.

Last year, 90% of all CFC funds were given through payroll deductions. Payroll deductions begin in January and continue through December. Donors in 2009 gave an average of \$242 by payroll deduction compared with an average cash or check gift of \$62.
