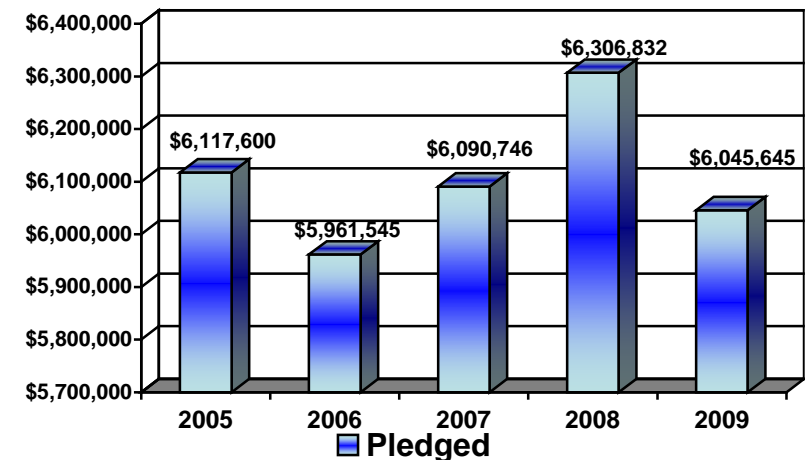
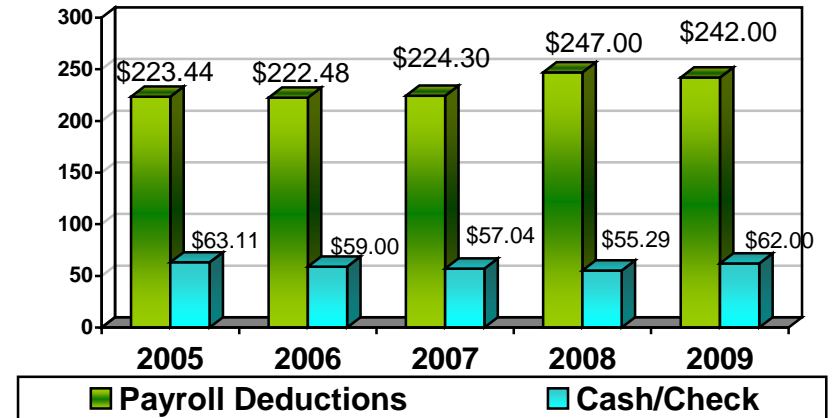

Using payroll deductions is one of the greatest advantages of giving through the CFC. Payroll deduction is often the easiest way to give. A donor is able to spread his or her gift over the entire year.

Last year, 70% of all CFC funds were given through payroll deductions. Payroll deductions begin in January and continue through December. Donors in 2009 gave an average of \$242 by payroll deduction compared with an average cash or check gift of \$62.



The Federal employees under the Hawaii-Pacific Area Combined Federal Campaign have always been very supportive of the campaign. This outstanding achievement attests to the generosity and community spirit of our Federal military and civilian employees.

Overall, the 2009 Campaign saw a ~2% increase in contributions raised by donors in Guam. The 2008 campaign raised \$474,615 and the 2009 campaign raised \$485,899.

ATTENTION DoD Personnel Guam/Northern Marianas

In 2007, for the first time, DoD personnel in Guam and the Northern Marianas were included in the Hawaii-Pacific Area Combined Federal Campaign. Prior to 2007, the DoD personnel were solicited as part of the Overseas Campaign.

The most relevant change to your campaign is the inclusion of local Guam and Northern Marianas charities in the Charity List. While all CFCs follow the same regulations, the Overseas Campaign does not include local charity listings.
